Which Items to Bring to Campus

- ✓ Pillows & bed linens for twin bed. Longer sheets may be your best choice as bed types vary (see below for mattress sizes)
- ✓ Towels, wash cloths, toiletry caddy, bathrobe
- ✓ UL-approved power strips & 3-pronged extension cords
- ✓ Mini-Refrigerator (4.0 cubic foot maximum – one per room) OR MicroFridge® Combination Appliance (one per room)
- ✓ Laptop or desktop computer & cords
- ✓ Cable ready TV, stereo, alarm clock, fan
- ✓ Telephone & Long Distance Calling Card
- ✓ Bike, bike lock, skates, skis
- ✓ Automobiles are permitted: Registration is \$50 per year
- ✓ School supplies, laundry bag (a small amount of Black Bear Buck is needed on your MaineCard for laundry), personal supplies, sewing kit

Talk to your roommate about what items each of you intend to bring to furnish your room.

Which Items to Leave at Home

- X Electrical appliances with heating elements: hot plates, coffee pot, toaster oven, sandwich maker, toaster
- X Stand alone microwave ovens (except MicroFridge® appliances)
- X Halogen lamps, neon signs, candles, incense
- X Inexpensive, unsafe 2-pronged extension cords
- X Air conditioners of any kind are prohibited
- X One-of-a-kind irreplaceable items
- X Large furniture items that will not fit in the room
- X Weapons and ammunition
- X Pets, except small fish in bowl or small tank
- X Alcohol if under 21 years old or a resident of The Well Housing
- X Illegal and/or un-prescribed drugs

Student Room Furnishings: All student rooms and apartments are fully furnished. Residence hall rooms contain:

- Desk & Chair
- Dresser & Mirror
- Bed
- Recycling baskets
- Closet for each occupant
- Windows vary in size but most have 4" blinds
- Internet, cable TV, & local phone jacks

Rooms vary in terms of styles of furniture. It is not possible to list what styles are in each room. As we upgrade and renovate, we are slowly consolidating our styles. University furniture cannot be removed from original rooms or exchanged for other university furniture. Most residence hall rooms are not carpeted; they have tile floors.

Mattresses: Most of our newest mattresses are 36"x80"x6". Our older beds are outfitted with a mattress that measures 36"x76"x6". You may wish to consider purchasing extra-long twin sheets, as they will fit all beds.
