

## **National SMART (Science And Mathematics Access to Retain Talent) Grant**

### **Third Academic Year Undergraduate Students (48-71 cumulative credits)**

- ❖ The maximum SMART Grant award is \$4000 (up to two semesters of \$2000)

The SMART Grant is available to students who meet the following criteria:

- be a Federal Pell Grant recipient
- be a U. S. citizen
- be enrolled full-time in a degree program
- be enrolled in one of the federally designated majors related to math and science (contact the Office of Student Financial Aid for a list of majors)
- be enrolled in at least one course that meets the specific requirements of the student's National SMART Grant-eligible major (the course does not need to be offered by the academic department that confers the degree in the eligible major, however if the student is enrolled only in courses that satisfy general education requirements and not in any major specific courses, he or she would not be eligible for the National SMART Grant)
- demonstrate financial need
- have a cumulative GPA of 3.0 or higher each semester (funds will not officially be awarded until the 3.0 cumulative GPA has been confirmed prior to each semester)

### **Fourth Academic Year Undergraduate Students (72-96 cumulative credits)**

- ❖ The maximum SMART Grant award is \$4000 (up to two semesters of \$2000)

The SMART Grant is available to students who meet the following criteria:

- be a Federal Pell Grant recipient
- be a U. S. citizen
- be enrolled full-time in a degree program
- be enrolled in one of the federally designated majors related to math and science (contact the Office of Student Financial Aid for a list of majors)
- be enrolled in at least once course that meets the specific requirements of the student's National SMART Grant-eligible major (the course does not need to be offered by the academic department that confers the degree in the eligible major, however if the student is enrolled only in courses that satisfy general education requirements and not in any major specific courses, he or she would not be eligible for the National SMART Grant)
- demonstrate financial need
- have a cumulative GPA of 3.0 or higher each semester (funds will not officially be awarded until the 3.0 cumulative GPA has been confirmed prior to each semester)
